#### Sept. 12/17 Guest Speaker Marilyn McLean from Kingston Street Mission.

Marilyn was welcomed to our C.W.L. General Meeting by Danna Dobson. Marilyn had a photo display for us to look at. The Mission is at St. Andrew's Presbyterian Church-corner of Princess and Clergy Street, Kingston, ON -is open from October to May and hopes to be available seven nights in near future. It is a donation based non-profit Agency. Volunteers have shifts from 8PM to Midnight with always two people present for safety and insurance purposes. Volunteers serve, encourage, become friends and give love to their guests and also offer coffee, tea, hot chocolate with marshmallows. They receive bread from Cobb's Bread so they can make sandwiches for the guests. On Sunday nights, they offer a free meal. Sometimes, musicians come and provide entertainment. A volunteer offered foot soaks to the guests one evening. Each evening, they usually have 20-25 guests. Marilyn held a birthday party recently and all the guests received cake and a gift card for Tim Horton's. She would like to make this an annual event if she is able to get a sponsor. They accept donations such as \$5 Tim Horton cards, \$5 McDonald's cards, socks, clothing, coats, blankets, tarps, and with winter coming, they are asking for mittens, hats, coats and sleeping bags. Marilyn talked briefly on Human Trafficking in Kingston and area. She works undercover with police officers to help stop this. She referred us to a website called Timea's Cause (<a href="https://www.timeascause.ca/">https://www.timeascause.ca/</a>) started by a girl who is a survivor of Human Trafficking. Timea has set up a sanctuary to help survivors.

Marilyn advised that Harbor Light will take in men at night and "In from the cold" in Kingston can provide shelter for a few people. Elizabeth Fry is open from 9PM-2AM. More shelters for homeless are needed in Kingston. The Kingston mayor states that he has a 10 year poverty plan but to date there is little progress.

Marilyn left cards regarding a Paint Nite Virtual Fundraiser-cost \$15. She will have a booth at Shop Local – a trade show to be held at the Ambassador Hotel this month.

Mary Lou thanked Marilyn and gave her a card and donation from our C.W.L. council.

Danna wishes to thank our members for their donation of \$230.00-it will be given to Marilyn soon.
